Dear Christ's Disciples,

We have come to the close of another year. It's so hard to believe how time flies! But I say that every year. Actually, every so often in the course of a year as the situation suits such a statement. Usually we just say such things without thinking; other times there is something more to it.

I've said it out of relief, like a "Glad that's over!" Many said that just after the elections. It's been a brutal one with few standing on the sidelines. November 8 laid bare the growing divisions in our society. Many have felt more and more that they are left out of society's processes. Others have never gotten in there in the first place because of who they are, where they are from, what they look like, and a host of other reasons pointing at them. It's resulted in anger, blaming, suspicion, rejection, fear, prejudice, etc. It's created a complex caste system full of barriers.

Mike, my older brother, didn't sing much when we were growing up...at least not when people were around I guess. But I do remember him intoning John Lennon's song often and almost under his breath:

Imagine there's no heaven...Imagine all the people living for today.
Imagine there's no countries...Imagine all the people living life in peace,
Imagine no possessions...Imagine all the people sharing all the world.

You may say I'm a dreamer
But I'm not the only one
I hope someday you'll join us
And the world will live as one.

The part that always troubled me was "and no religion too." But since those days I have learned that we religious types can get in the way of others living, sharing, dreaming. For Christians, that means we push back on the foundation of our faith: A Messiah who came to tear down the barriers by bringing healing with a cross and raising up a faithful people who join with others in caring for others.

I know that seems so simplistic...But do let me dream that this Advent we disciples of Christ will make more than an effort at repairing broken places and alienated people; that we offer "sweat equity" so that "the world will live as one."

Let me dream that we disciples will look into ourselves to root out from ourselves those convictions and tendencies that separate. Most times it's not about the big stuff, but about what happens in our day-to-day: Who we talk to and don't talk to; how we view others; what we say to people who cross us; when we give up our deeply held anger and resentment.

I promise I will try to do so. I call upon you to take this Advent to do the same.

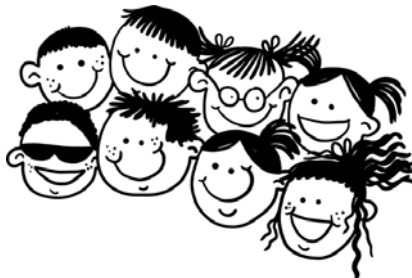

Our VISION (Questions Answered and What is Next)

Why do we need a Vision? -

"Where there is no vision the people perish." Proverbs

Individually, each of us has dreams (a Vision) of what we want to have and be in our lives. We don't start out with a detailed plan to achieve our dreams; we choose a direction that sets us on a path toward those dreams. That direction leads us in a path that offers the opportunities to successfully achieve our dreams. Failure to select an appropriate direction and rely purely on random opportunities as they overcome us leads us only to discontent, dissatisfaction and unfulfillment.

In Oprah Winfrey's words *"You must have some Vision for your life, even if you don't know the plan, you have to have a direction in which you choose to go. You want to be in the driver seat for your life, because if you are not, life will drive you."*

Christ Lutheran's or any church's existence (purpose) is not to just to be a place for people to come as individuals to attend a 1 hour Sunday worship service from 2 to 52 times a year. That role is for road-side or hospital chapels for drive-by prayer when we think we need a quick fix from God. A church and especially our congregation should be a living and growing faith community where we hear and share the word of God in Scriptures as a community and then as a community live out our Faith serving our neighbors in ministries that reveal God's love. That requires that we not only have a chosen direction, we have short-term and long-term plans to achieve our dreams or our calling from God.

The Vision Committee compiled congregation input during 2012 to 2014, studied Scripture and prayed for God's purpose and direction to be made known. Jesus' two commandments, the first that we shall love the Lord our God with all our heart, and with all our soul, and with all our minds, and the that we shall love our neighbor as ourselves weighed heavily in the assessment and decision making. From these and an understanding of our past and present our Vision was born in the form of **"We reveal God's Love."** The council approved this Vision Statement in early February of 2015 and the Congregation approved the Vision Statement at a Congregational Meeting, February 28, 2016.

With that Vision, much positive work has been accomplished in 2015 and 2016.

Stabilizing the annual operating budgets and the process for budget development.

Development and congregational approval of Continuing Resolutions reflecting Christ Lutheran organization and responsibilities as required by our Constitution.

Stabilizing, repairing and improving infrastructure to better serve the congregation and support our ministries.

Formalized communications channels to keep members informed and participating

Improved hospitality and welcoming practices to enhance relationship building with visitors looking for a new church.

Etc.

Vision 2017 and beyond (Our future):

VISION is the power and ability of our MIND to see and anticipate that which will or may come to be in the FUTURE. Successfully achieving our Vision also requires that we address the routine work of Near and Long-Term Planning. To Reveal God's Love in a world that is in dire need of love and understanding, we must assess what is needed of our ministries, by whom within our congregation and in our local and extended communities. We must assess, adjust, strengthen, and align our resources to our Vision. We must identify the changes that affect us and address their resolution prior to incurring adverse impacts.

Long-term (5 year) planning is our focus and it is everyone's business because major change is upon us. It is reasonable to say that within the next 5 years we will see retirements of our staff and a call for a new Pastor and perhaps Music Director, major refurbishment of infrastructure, and changes in the demographics of our congregation. In 2017 and the years to come, there is no place for silence or the withholding of opinions, or questions and comments. Most importantly, we must come to a deeper and complete understanding of who we are and what we need and want. We will need constant and clear dialog with no non-participating or "silent but dissatisfied" members. The next step in Vision is our Long-term planning, establishment of goals and objectives, assessments and prioritizations. The Vision Committee will now become the Long-term planning committee and at one time or another, each of us must contribute to come to a Long-term plan we can approve as a Congregation.

An information, question and answer session to discuss Long-term planning is tentatively planned in early January following the second service on Sunday, January 8 and again on Tuesday, January 10 at 6:30 pm. Both in the Conference room.
