
## Village Nights Begin September 14 Potluck at 5:45 p.m.

## FINANCE SUMMARY

The Finance Team is pleased to report that through the end of July 2016 we continue to be blessed with the solid and loyal financial support of our disciples. Our offerings were ahead of our projections as well as being ahead of our expenses. This is particularly good news considering we have been able to accomplish this during the summer months, a time when offerings are traditionally lower than at other times during the year.

The Finance Team and Council have been able to keep expenses generally in line with our 2016 budget, however this summer we have had to address some significant unexpected repairs to our heating and air conditioning systems. The fact that actual offerings at this point have exceeded actual expenses, has given council the flexibility to address these repairs as they have occurred. In addition, the positive results have enabled council to look at other facility maintenance and repair issues that are needed to keep our building in good operating order.

The 2017 Budget that is currently being prepared by the Finance Team will be considering how best to address our on-going property maintenance requirements along with the other needs and objectives of our church.

**ACTS Class This Fall**  
(Ambassadors Community for Theological Study)

**October 1 & 29**

**Course Title: *It's Not About You, It's About You:*  
*Joining God's Work in Process - A Biblical Look at Leadership***

What is the Virginia Synod's ACTS Class Program of Faith Formation? It's goals are:

To increase in a disciple's ability to intentionally live and share the Christian faith.

To develop in a disciple a fuller understanding of the Bible, the theology of our church, and the practice of ministry.

To equip disciples for special areas of ministry and service as ambassadors for Christ.

The course at Christ Church will consist of 10 hours of large-group instruction by a gifted teacher, offered in two five hour Saturday sessions in Waynesboro. Plus five two hour small groups, usually done on a weeknight chosen by the group and led by Pastor Eric.

This fall, Dr. Terri Martinson Elton, Associate Professor of Leadership at Luther Seminary, will look at the importance of balancing our role as leaders with God's. Participants will frame this understanding of leadership biblically, explore the leadership of various leaders in the Bible, and discover habits, practices, and skills that ministry leaders exhibit at this time in history.

Our hope is that we have a minimum of 9 participants so that the cost will be a maximum of \$50. ### **Confirmation Classes Begin September 18**

Our Confirmation Program will have a new day and time this year. Instead of meeting during Village Nights on Wednesday, Confirmation classes will be held on Sundays, 4-5 pm. This a 2-year program for youth beginning in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade (and can include students who are in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade).

The orientation session with parents and students will be September 18 at 4 pm, with acolyte/crucifer training, Youth Gathering orientation and a potluck following. If you have not already, let Pastor Eric know you are coming.

Eight people from Christ Lutheran Church volunteered a week of service to the **Appalachia Service Project** in Guyan Valley, Brenton, West Va. The adventure began Sunday, August 7, 2016. On our way to West VA we were treated to a delicious breakfast at Cracker Barrel.



We stayed at the Appalachia Service Project (ASP) Center which is a converted school building. Women slept on bunk beds in one large room, while the men slept on bunk beds in another large room.

Two other church groups joined us for this week of service. One group was from Richmond and the other from Maryland. We ate breakfast and dinner together in a large dining room and took turns doing morning and evening devotions. There were three ASP staff people who played instruments and we sang together. Another evening someone from the Wyoming County Historical Society came and spoke

to us about Brenton, West VA. Since there was no TV the young people played board games & listened to music. The Center was air conditioned but had no cell phone reception. We had to drive up a mountain to use our cell phones. The weather was hot and humid that at the end of each day a shower felt great.

Every day after breakfast we made our sandwiches for lunch. We ate peanut butter & jelly or turkey & cheese. We were fortunate to have a cook who prepared breakfast and dinner every day. The Center posted a calendar with chores for us to do. The chores were to clean up after breakfast & dinner, mop floors in Center and clean bathrooms.

After breakfast we left the center and went next door to the warehouse for work supplies. We had enough volunteers to form two teams.

Team One consisted of Sarah Pernsteiner, Greg Faust, Darren D'Ateno and Mat Lewis. Their project was to build two 16 foot girders and install them under a two story addition of the family's primary house. We had to excavate seven holes for cement footers and install 4x4 supports under the girders. To do this three sections of floor had to be removed to allow access. The addition had to be jacked into place very carefully so as not to damage sheet rock installed the previous week. Once we had access under the house, we used shovels, pick axe and a jack hammer to remove the dirt. The mission team from Maryland offered help from three strong young men to install the girders and screw the supports into place. This project was more than we anticipated but with God's help and guidance it was completed by Friday afternoon.

Team Two consisted of Jim Pickels, Jim Schnellenberger, Clayton Varney and Sylvia Lewis. We worked on a small house which desperately needed a lot of work. A woman lived there alone and one of our jobs was to install a counter top, sink and running water in the kitchen. Another job was to prime and paint the walls in the kitchen. There was no light fixture in the kitchen so we ran an extension cord to another room. New shelves were cut, painted and installed for kitchen cabinets. There were no cabinet doors and that was ok with the owner. The owner was worried about rodents coming into the house so she asked us to patch up the holes in the walls near the floor. A previous team of volunteers built a handicap ramp so we added a concrete slab at the end of the ramp. Another big job was to remove two old rooms attached to the back of the house. The metal roof was removed along with the siding. We cleaned up some of the trash left in the yard.

Thursday after work we all drove to a lake for a picnic sponsored by ASP for volunteers and families. Team one's family came to the picnic. The home owners were very appreciative our hard work and help. Team two's lady loved having a new sink and running water in the kitchen. We spent some time talking with her. She does not have reliable transportation and there is no mail delivery where she lives. ASP has been helping her with getting her mail. She has a small friendly black dog who is a good companion for her. She told us another team of volunteers was coming to help her after we left.

Pastor Eric said we would love this mission trip which is about relationships, and it would change our lives. It was rewarding and certainly challenging.

Hopefully, next year more young people will be willing to go and serve. Thank you all for your support.
